Joseph J. Vieira, one of Jacksonville's oldest and best known Portuguese citizens, died at Dr. Day's hospital Friday evening at 7 o'clock. Mr. Vieira had been ill for some time and death resulted from a complication of diseases.

Deceased was born in the Island of Madeira in December, 1843. He came to this country with his parents in November, 1849, the family coming directly to Jacksonville, where he has since resided.

During the civil war he enlisted in Company G, 101st regiment(it was Co. C), in this city. He was severely wounded in the battle of Resaca, Ga., and his whole record in the army was one of bravery and patriotic devotion to duty.

Mr. Vieira was a member of Northminster church and was always active in the work of the church, living his daily life above reproach. He also was a member of the S. P. Ph. And of Matt Star Post, G. A. R.

He was united in marriage many years ago to Miss Anna DeFrates, who has been an especially devoted wife. She survives him, and also one brother, Jackson J. Vieira, of this city, and one step-brother, Gregory DeFrates of Virginia.

The funeral will be conducted from Northminster church Sunday afternoon at 2:30 o'clock, in charge of the pastor, Rev. Walter E. Spoonts.
